# WWMD TURNS ORANGE

June is National Gun Violence Awareness Month. While the mission of WWMD is not solely wrapped around Gun Violence we do fully support Gun Violence initiatives. As most of our followers know our foundation is based on the robbery and murder of Marcus Marquis Payne who was shot on August 30, 2021 and later died on September 11, 2021 making him Columbus, Ohio's 141st Homicide. We turn orange for the month of June to support and bring awareness to the senseless acts of gun violence in our city.

The WWMD Leadership team has made their pledge to support the Operation Under Triple Digits Campaign in conjunction with Mothers of Murdered Columbus Children. Operation Under Triple Digits is a citywide collaborative initiative that will use crime data to drive decision-making and response of community organizations, residents, Faith-based networks, elected officials, law enforcement and all stakeholders that desire to reduce crime and rebuild a safer Columbus.


